AUDITION

We are always looking for qualified musicians to increase the performance caliber of our ensembles. Auditions are not limited to those instruments with immediate openings; any highly qualified musician is encouraged to audition.

By serving part-time in the 39th Army Band you can pay for college, perform professionally and have fun while making new friends and serving your community.

We are always looking for quality musicians to join us.

If you are interested in auditioning, or simply sitting in with the band, please feel free to contact us at any time.

We conduct auditions throughout the year; interested musicians may contact the 39th Army Band at 603-715-3104 to schedule an audition.

Once accepted, qualified applicants who are not prior military would be eligible to enlist through the Civilian Acquired Skills Program (CASP). This allows enlistment at the accelerated rank of Specialist (E4). New soldiers are then required to complete 10 weeks of Basic Training, followed by 10 weeks of Advanced Individual Training (AIT) held in Norfolk Virginia at the School of Music.



THE COMMANDER

Chief Warrant Officer Sean Pinsonneault

Mr. Pinsonneault began his military career in 1992 as an Active Duty Infantryman with the 1st Armored Division, Mannheim Germany. He was assigned as a mortar man, and held positions as ammo bearer, assistant gunner, gunner, and fire direction control.

In 1996 Mr. Pinsonneault enlisted in the 39th Army Band in the rank of Private First Class as a trumpet player. Through the years he has served as the trumpet Section Leader, High Brass Group Leader, Jazz Band Conductor, and Acting First Sergeant.

His Army education and training consists of Primary Leader Development Course, Basic Non-Commissioned Officer Course, Senior Leader Course, WO Candidate School, WO Basic Course, WO Advanced Course, Modern Army Combatives Instructor Level II and Airborne School.

Mr. Pinsonneault received his appointment at the Warrant Officer Candidate School, Fort Rucker, Alabama during the summer of 2011 and assumed the duties of Commander of the 39th Army Band in January 2012.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Who can join the 39th Army Band?

Any musician, male or female, who meets Army enlistment standards and can pass a pre-arranged audition with the unit.

If I take an audition, do I have to enlist?

No! You are under no obligation to enlist.

How long is Army Basic Training?

Army Basic Training is approximately 10 weeks long.

How much will I be paid for Basic Training?

This varies anywhere from \$2,800 up to almost \$4,000. It depends on how much money you spend while in basic training.

Do I have to attend any additional training?

Yes, Advanced Individual Training (AIT) held in Norfolk VA. The course length is 10 weeks long. You can complete Basic Training and AIT one right after the other or complete basic training and wait up to 1 year to complete the 10-week AIT portion.

When do you practice?
